Welcome

The Hanseatic city of Rostock, founded in the 13th century is the largest city in the German state of Mecklenburg-Vorpommern (MV) with approximately 209.000 residents. It sprawls along both sides of the river Warnow including its large international port on the Baltic Sea.

Rostock has many historic points of interest – the monumental Marien Church with its valuable art treasures, the Holy Cross Monastery near the University's main building, founded in 1419 and the reconstructed 117m high steeple of the Petri Church.

Warnemünde, a seaside resorts on the Baltic coast, is an attractive part of Rostock and worth a visit for a stroll or a day on the beach. The "Alte Strom", the Westmole and the Marine Promenade with its lighthouse attract many tourists.

How to get to Rostock?

BY AIR

Rostock only has a small regional airport. For air travel, please select one of the following and continue with Deutsche Bahn (www.bahn.de), FlixBus or car.

Airport Berlin-Brandenburg Willy Brandt (BER):

- By car on the A113, A111, A24 and A19 direction Hamburg/Rostock
- By train or FlixBus to Rostock Hbf (Central Station)

Airport Hamburg (HAM):

- By car on the A20 direction Lübeck/Rostock
- By train or FlixBus to Rostock Hbf (Central Station)

Airport Lübeck (LBC):

- By car on the A20 direction Rostock
- By train or FlixBus to Rostock Hbf (Central Station)

BY RAIL

Most (overnight) trains travel via Berlin or Hamburg. Use www.trainline.com to find the best European rail connections.

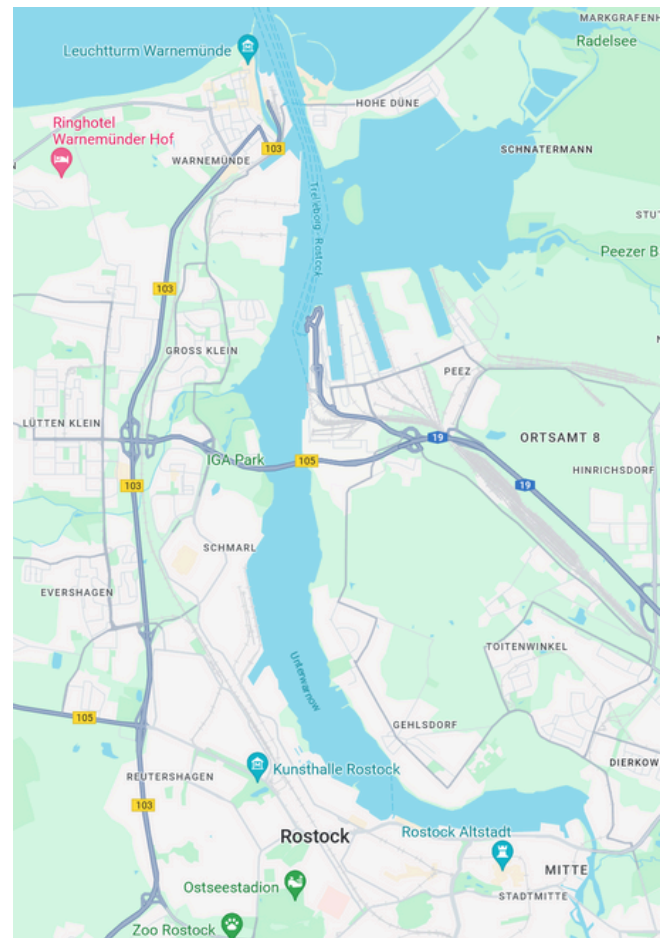
PUBLIC TRANSIT IN THE CITY CENTER

The Rostock City Center is very walkable. Public transit trams and busses are available. Please check www.rsag-online.de for the best routes and connections. Tickets are available at the stations, on the platforms or directly on busses and trams.

- Short trip (limited to 4 stops in the City Center): 2,10 €
- Regular ticket (90min travel in one direction): 2,80€
- TIP: Save by purchasing a "4er Ticket" (4 regular tickets): 9,50€

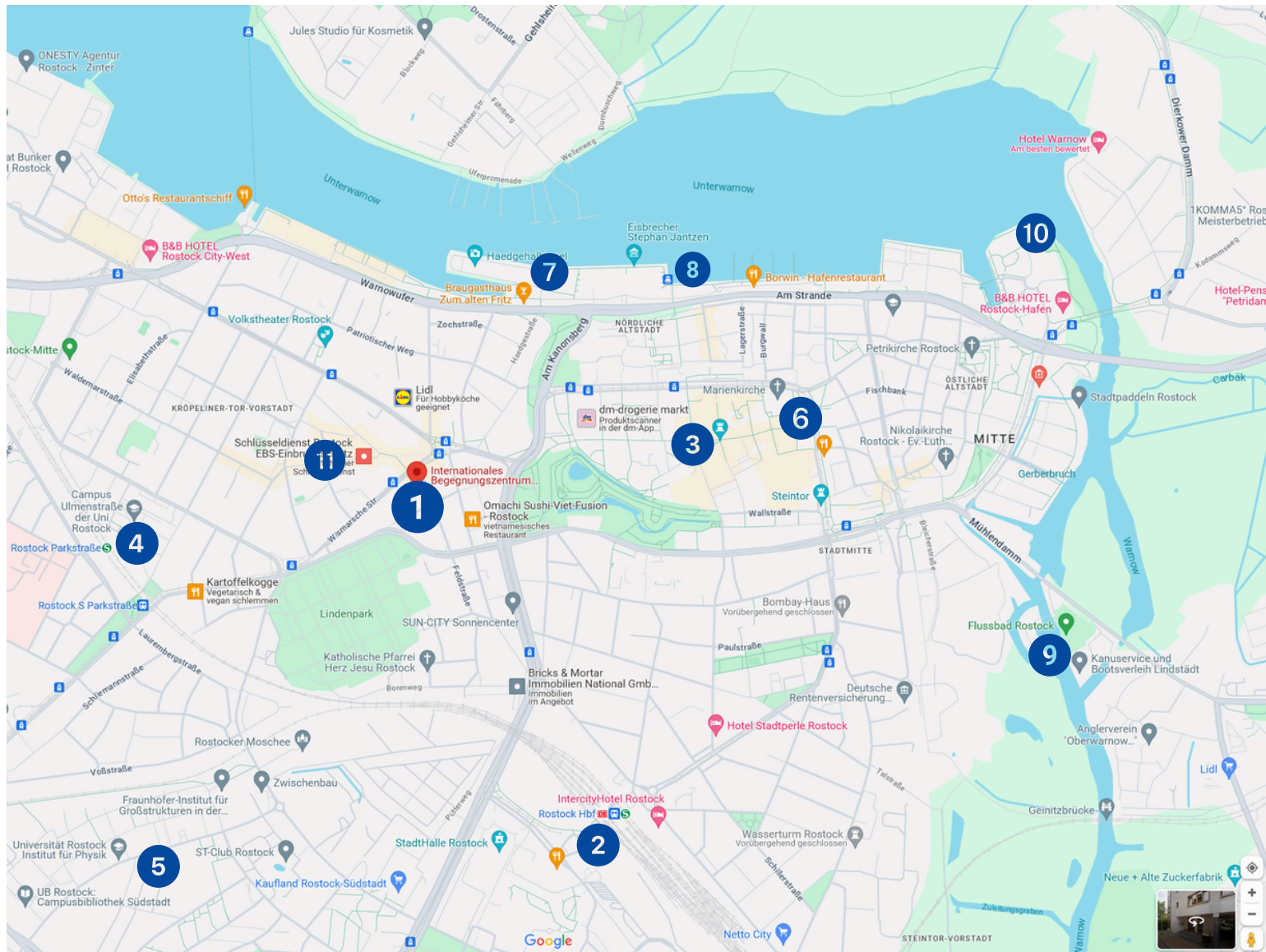
PUBLIC TRANSIT TO/FROM WARNEMÜNDE

The S-Bahn (looks like the trains by Deutsche Bahn) run frequently during the summer to and from Warnemünde. The train ride takes about 20 minutes. Purchase your ticket before boarding the train.
