2. Observations of interest

Six supervisors participated in the Master thesis supervisor survey. Overall satisfaction with their students' master thesis was high (M=4.83) and average value was 4.45.

Although results suggest a very high level of supervisors' satisfaction with Master Thesis, these results should be taken with caution. A very small number of responses were collected which does not allow strong conclusions. As only 30% of supervisors completed this very short survey, it is needed to address possible obstacles that prevented them from completing the survey.
